FACS PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Steve Roland gave an overview of our stats for the last grant year, 08-09. Over **60,000 tips** have come in, clearing **11,000 cases** and causing **6,000 arrests**. Stolen property recovered was \$15,000,000 and narcotics recovered were just short of \$25,000,000. He then went over his presidency. He reminded us of the playing cards which started in Polk County and are now all over the country. We went from 28 programs in this state to 32. The partnership with the Humane Society began. The Mentoring Committee was formed. The relationship between FACS and the OAG's office and various legislators has been strengthened. A steering committee was put in place, and they were able to get the surcharges on fines changed to stand alone fines. We were successful in having \$3.5 million dollars that been swept by the Legislature restored. In concluding, he said that he feels that he left FACS in a better place than where he found it, and he is hopeful that the next president will do the same.

Crime Stoppers Becomes a Crime Victim

SOUTH BEND, Ind. — South Bend Area Crime Stoppers faces an investigation over missing money and other financial irregularities that may date back a decade. On paper, Crime Stoppers had been dissolved in 2008 because it failed to file an annual report since April 21, of 2003. Police are conducting a criminal investigation into problems that include a failure to file reports with the Internal Revenue Service, Secretary of State and Indiana Department of Revenue. The group learned of the irregularities after being told it was at risk of losing its nonprofit status for failing to file the reports. In addition to all the missing paperwork, there's a fair amount of funds that can't be accounted for. The investigation into the missing money apparently focuses on one individual, and the irregularities may date back ten years or more. *Panhandle Crime Stopper Board of Directors is amazed about this case. How could it happen? All of those things are checked. We must be ever vigilant. Wherever there is money there is a crook trying to steal it. The editor*
