This is thanks to the quick action of Investigator Brian Miller and Lt. Andy Smith. The SRD's and the sheriff are behind the program completely and the students are well aware of what they can do. Another bit of information was called in but was not determined to be a valid tip. Our billboards and materials provided to the schools for handouts have really helped increase the awareness of Student Crime Stoppers. Regina Alderman

Program Supervisor, Anchorage Children's Home Regina Alderman began with Anchorage Children's Home as the Lead Street Outreach Specialist in January of 2008. The Street Outreach Program provides street based outreach to homeless youth and at risk youth. The program has national partnerships which enables youth in crisis immediate contact to the program. She received a block grant that allows the program to serve the adult homeless population in the Panama City area. She works alongside the Panama City Police Downtown Policing Unit. Alderman also volunteers at the Bay County Jail to assist incarcerated homeless transition back into the workforce and off the streets. Alderman worked in the music industry starting as a rhythm guitarist in several rock bands for ten years, and a traveling guitar player in a rock and roll roadie. She became the publisher of a rock and roll magazine, managed and produced independent artists and provided independent public relations and marketing for record labels. Alderman uses her rock and roll background for the structure of the Street Outreach Program. The program received the 2010 Model Program of the Year Award, one of the highest honors in federally funded programs. With an increase in identified human trafficking cases in the panhandle by the Street Outreach team, Anchorage Children's Home received federal funding from the Office of Refugee Resettlement for community education. With guidance from other agencies and previous experience Alderman developed the local Northwest Florida Human Trafficking Coalition in May 2010. Alderman was born in Cleveland Ohio and has lived all across the United States. Regina credits life experiences as a homeless teen for the driving force behind the success of the Outreach Program.
